**DGN Rob Woolley** addressed our members; he said that he was born in Nowra, the son of fourth generation Dairy Farmers. He worked for 2 years on the family farm before taking up an apprenticeship as an Automotive Engineer. He moved to Shoalhaven City Council at the end of his apprenticeship to work as a mechanic, auto electrician, supervisor and plant manager. In 1985 Rob joined the Commonwealth Public Service as a Technical Officer and progressed to Manager of Leasing and Maintenance for the ACT Government.

Rob talked on the Four Way Test speaking competition at the incoming District Conference in Oct and he also asked for District Team members for his DG year, please advise Rob if you can help.

**PDG Noel Trevaskis** was presented with a \$1,000 cheque for the Australian Rotary Health (formerly known as the ARHRF). The origin of Australian Rotary Health in 1981 was the mystery of Sudden Infant Death Syndrome (SIDS). The Late Ian Scott, from the RC of Mornington, established the Fund to support research into SIDS. The ARF is supported by Rotarians Australian wide, the research is investigated in Australia and for the benefit of Australians. Right now over 4 million dollars is set aside by the ARF to research mental illness of 5 to 17 year old, early detection and treatment.

**Guest Speaker Julie Williams** is a social welfare worker identifying children with difficulties. Julie is one of thirty one National Disability Coordination Officer; NDCO program targets the barriers that people with a disability face in gaining access to and successfully completing post school education and training.

The program is funded by the Australian Government Department of Education, Employment and Workplace Relations and hosted within the region by Northcott Disability Services. The program aims at changing the way people feel about disabilities and hope to make a difference.

Julie asked us to promote the program and encourage employers to hire disabled even for only a few hours a week as it improves their self esteem.

Employers can receive government funding to improve employment facilities if engaging people with disabilities.

### **ABOUT: Ambassadorial Scholarships**

The Rotary Foundation's oldest and best-known program was founded in 1947. Since then, nearly 38,000 men and women from about 100 nations have studied abroad under its auspices. Today it is the world's largest privately funded international scholarships program. Nearly 800 scholarships were awarded for study in 2005-06. Through grants totalling approximately US\$500 million, recipients from about 70 countries studied in more than 70 nations.

The program sponsors several types of scholarships for undergraduate and graduate students as well as for qualified professionals pursuing vocational studies. While abroad, scholars serve as goodwill ambassadors to the host country and give presentations about their homelands to Rotary clubs and other groups. Upon returning home, scholars share with Rotarians and others the experiences that led to a greater understanding of their host country.

Although applicants are asked to list their preferred study locations, the Foundation Trustees reserve the right to make assignments to any suitable institution to ensure the widest possible geographical distribution of scholars. Candidates must be flexible in their study institution assignments.

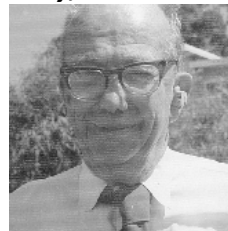
### **RI President John Kenny; from his July 09 message:**

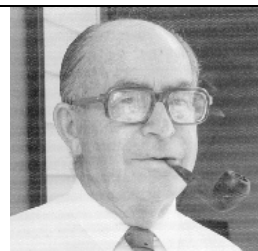
**1961-62 Pres Frank Bean.**

A competition for school students was promoted and students were invited to write essays on the Four Way Test, with 2 prizes of £3.00 each to the winners.

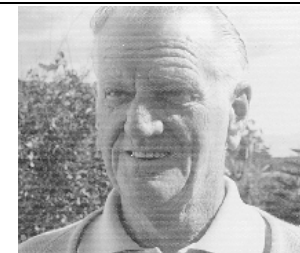


**1962-63 Pres Harold Kendall.**
