From Rotary International: "REACH ONE, KEEP ONE"

The RI Board of Directors adopted a new membership slogan, "Each Rotarian: Reach One, Keep One," at its June 09 meeting.

The slogan emphasizes the need for Rotarians to focus on both recruitment and retention in their membership growth efforts.

"Membership development is each Rotarian's responsibility," said Paul Netzel, a member of RI's Membership Development and Retention Committee and a past RI director.

"'Reach One' reminds us that because Rotary membership is by invitation, it's essential that each Rotarian reaches out and invites someone to join," added Netzel, a member of the Rotary Club of Los Angeles.

"'Keep One' reminds us that it's not sufficient to simply sponsor someone into Rotary; we must also see that new members become active and involved Rotarians. We know this is an essential element in membership retention."

A Bowls Day held at Milton Ulladulla Bowling Club to raise funds for the completion of the Rotary Lookout, \$200 was raised.

The first nominees for the RYLA Camp made by the Club and the first Showgirl selected as the Rotary entrant in the local show competition, being Miss Gloria Brown.

The Minister for Justice of the time, Mr John Maddison MLA, was guest speaker at a meeting in May 1968 and the other local service clubs, being APEX, Lions and Quota, were invited to join us on this occasion.

Dinner fees were increased during the year to \$1.20 per head.

The Conference will be held from Friday, 23rd October until after lunch Sunday, 25th October 2009.

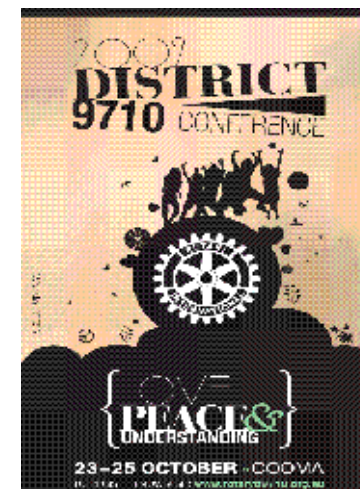
The Conference will be held at the Cooma Multi Function Centre, located at the Cooma Showground.
