Peter Culham; attendance 84.1%



Two lamington drives were arranged throughout the year and the very active support of our Rotary Ladies was greatly appreciated. Funds from these drives were used to support the following projects; Naran Centre, Rhodesia \$90.00, Macau Orphanage \$80.00 and the Child Education Centre in Tonga for the continuing education of 2 children \$75.00 and \$200.00 to the Rotary Foundation.

Main fund-raising activities included running the Calcutta Sweep in connection with the Melbourne Cup, a Ladies Night and Family BBQ night at Ringland's Farm which attracted a large contingent of visitors, Greig Ringland supplying hayrides and cow milking contests.

We sponsored Miss Katherina Eaton for the Milton A and H Show, a Rotary float and princess was entered for the Blessing of the Fleet

Labour was supplied to assist operating the Steak Bar at the Easter celebration as well as at the Milton Show including the Liquor Bar.

We arranged Transport for disabled diggers on ANZAC Day.

Life line lights were installed.

We maintained the lawns and surrounds, providing labour and material for fences at the Legacy homes in Milton.

For the first time Mollymook had a cup meeting, we were involved with providing labour for the Steak Bar, supported Meals on Wheels and sponsored 2 RYLA Students, Miss Anne Scharkie and Miss Janet Nicholls.
