Brown. Gina has two children, lives at Conjola and is married to a policeman. Gina's talk centered around raising funds to promote and maintain a Crime Prevention Van in our district. Senior Constable Hamilton plans to speak with many of the community

service clubs in the Shoalhaven, seeking assistance in the ongoing support of the soon to be commissioned Crime Prevention Van.

The Van is being supplied by Toyota and has received start up funding and resources from several large and well known commercial operators, sponsors and Council. (Good Guys, Telstra, McDonalds, Jayco, Bomaderry Bowling Club, with Bunnings to conduct a fund raiser.)

However, Senior Constable Hamilton is seeking additional funding by way of direct contribution or by community fund raising efforts to sustain the ongoing operation of the first van and has hopes to get a second van on the road in the not too distant future. The Shoalhaven is a large territory for just one Van to cover

The van will be used to provide a receptive and well resourced police presence at events around the Shoalhaven with a particular emphasis on youth events.

The Crime Prevention Van that has been utilised in the Illawarra District has proven to have a positive influence at youth events, deterring anti social behaviours and engaging youth in beneficial interaction.
