Pia gave us a most enlightening talk on her area of expertise being aquaculture. Pia is the Director of Shoalhaven Maritime & Freshwater Centre being part of the Uni of Wollongong. She has her offices at Nowra.

Pia being a Swedish Expat took the opportunity to exchange some Swedish language with Elin.

Pia highlighted the enormous research and development that is taking place in the area of Sea Weed growth outside of the natural Marine parks in the ocean. Pia explained the numerous opportunities that exist in the pharmaceutical, cosmetic and other areas which all have seaweed composite materials.

Pia also outlined the experiments being carried out in the river tributaries with floodgates affecting the salinity of water which impacts on the development of prawns, fish and oysters.
