What is RYPEN

Rotary Program of Enrichment for young people between ages 14-17 years of age. Through a weekend seminar, RYPEN creates an awareness of the teens own place and responsibility in society, as well as offering the practical skills needed to exist in society.

Handicamp.

Handicamp provides an opportunity for young people with a disability, between the ages of 18-30, to attend a live-in camp. A camp comprises approximately 20 participants and 20 able bodied buddies.

There will be a Handicamp early in the New Year.

National Youth Science Forum (NYFF)

National Youth Science Forum is a 2 week summer school for year 11 students who are interested in pursuing a career in science or technology. Applicants are sponsored by clubs and finalists are selected by a district committee. NYSF forums are held in Canberra at the ANU Canberra. Forums are usually held in January.

Siemens Science Experience (SSE)

The SSE is for year 9 students who are selected to attend a three day school at various University campuses. This program gives students an insight into what they might expect if they choose a scientific or technology career.

These forums are usually held in the January also.

Rotary Youth Driving Awareness (RYDA)

This program targets awareness and attitudinal change and seeks to encourage young people, year 11, students, who are on the verge of driving or at least who are actively thinking about it, to take a more responsible attitude to motoring.
