Tabourie Lake RYC sail most Wednesday and Saturday afternoons throughout the year weather permitting at the south side of Tabourie Lake entrance or at Portland Way depending on wind direction or at Burrill Lake east of the bridge. During the year we hold an inter-club regatta, a ladies day and a championship day all followed by a BBQ in the grounds of the motel.

We only race one class of yacht, the Soling One Meter (S1M) which is a 1/6 scale model of the famous Olympic class yacht of yester-year. It is a kit boat of USA manufacture, readily available from hobby shops and is the least expensive of all the model yacht classes raced in Australia.

Other radio yacht clubs in NSW sailing Solings are....Central Coast RYC at Terrigal, Sydney Maritime Modelers at Norwest Park, Dobroid Aquatic Club at Rodd Point and The Basin RYC at Sanctuary Point who all hold interclub regattas and take turns to run the State Championships each year. In the USA there are thousands of the class in more than 850 clubs. This is because the Soling looks great, handles well and is relatively easy to build, as well as it's relatively low cost. It is the most popular of all the radio controlled yachts raced in the USA and the same trend is likely in Australia.

Being a one-design class yacht the S1M Class Rules allow very little variation from the standard kit. All the boats are the same so competition is all about skill. Most of us had never sailed a full size yacht so the learning curve was steep but interesting and a lot of fun.

The yacht has 2 channel radio controls for 2 servo motors, one for rudder and the other for sail positioning. Race rules and course layout are essentially the same as used for full size yachts and the overall design of the Soling allows it to realistically simulate big boat performance.

Radio sailing is great fun and age, gender or physical condition usually provide no barrier to anyone wanting to get involved with the sport of RC yacht racing. **We really would like a few more local members** so if you would like to know more please ask us (between races) or contact Steve Marr 4573337 (Commodore), Peter Maddison (Secretary) 44573250, Ted Wild (Treasurer) or Phil Hutchens (Mint Host) at the Tabourie Lake Motor Inn 44573133 where we can be found in the restaurant bar area after sailing.
