Guest Speaker Graham McLaren

The Club was entertained by Master Butcher Mr Graham McLaren who showed us the way butchers carve meat and how they bone, fold and wrap, in this instance, Lamb.

Graham, who owns Ulladulla Butchery, showed us his craft in amusing format and more importantly answered many questions from the floor, each which led us to understand why the prices are as high as they are.

We learned that the average Sheep/lamb is around 18/19 Kg and the lambs he buys are usually around 12 months old. Graham sources his meat from Cootamundra. Graham also told us that a lot of lamb comes from NZ but he prefers his Australian product.

Graham prefers to work with meat that has aged a minimum of 7-10 days so that the stress has been removed from the muscles of the beast. Cost of meat is very high because of the labour intensity associated with both slaughtering and then butchering.

Graham cut up a side into the following cuts; 1. A boned leg of lamb, 2. A boned fore quarter, 3. Lamb chops, 4. Chump chops and chump steaks 5. Loin of lamb. Each of the portions was then auctioned off with \$ 161 raised.
