Guest Speaker Bart Salafia



Bart has been a resident of Ulladulla since 1979. In his career he has operated a Smash Repair business in the 90's, been a Police Officer, and now the owner of Mountain Cycles. Bart is married to Alison with 4 children.

Bart's subject was Cycle Tourism. Bart explained that the definition of Cycle Tourism is a visit either overnight or a day away from home, which involves cycling as a significant part of the visit.

There are 2 types of Cycle Tourists;

1. Cycling Holidays and
2. Holiday cyclists.

Cycling is big! A significant proportion of the Australian population own bicycles- 18 million bikes purchased in Australia since 2000. 1.17 million bikes purchased in June 2010 alone. Bart mentioned that this is the 10th consecutive year that bikes have outsold cars at a rate of 10-1

In 2008, 1.9 million adults cycled which is an increase of 337,000 or 21% over the period in 2007. A significant contributor to this has been the increase in the number of women riders. An increase of 148,000 over the previous year!. The largest growth is happening in the age group of 35-44 which has seen an increase of 88,000 cyclists taking to the road since 2007.

Bart's big project is to establish the Ulladulla region as a major bike riding attraction with the use of the local area mountains and facilities. If he can that off the ground the Tourist dollars will come in. He quoted'

The Angry Doctor, at Mogo attracting 1500 participants

The Highland fling Bundanoon, also attracts 1500

Scott 24 hour Mt Stromlo in the ACT more than 2500 participants!. These events sell out within a week, with the Highland fling recently selling out in 6 hours. Each of the teams participating bring a minimum of 3 people and these all require victualling and in many cases accommodation.

Herbie Francis Visitor from Ireland



Herbie gave us a short recitation on life in Ireland at present in view of the current financial crisis. Things are not good and Rotary itself is being impacted with many resignations because of the business failures. In fact, Herbie mentioned that the hotel where they held their meetings went under forcing them to look elsewhere.

Herbie was an early President of Rotaract a Rotaract club in Ireland and took on the All Ireland presidency in the 70's. His background is now Local Government but in the past he has undertaken lots of different roles.

He loves Australia and was lured here through a Rotary connection in this area.
