Guest Speaker Al Emery spoke about organ donation. Al said that one hour of ones time every 3 months would save lives, that is what it takes to donate blood.

Joe Puglisi was asked to read a newspaper article about an accident victim in need of blood and a letter from an organ recipient, both letters were quite moving.

Al presented a few statistics; Australia is ranked 22nd out of 55 countries involved with organ donation program, last year 309 donors saved 986 lives.

At any one time there are over a thousand patients in Australia on a waiting list.

In a Scandinavian country one is a donor from birth. Ticking organ donation on your driver's licence is not sufficient to be one, you need to register with Medicare and most importantly let your family know of your wishes.

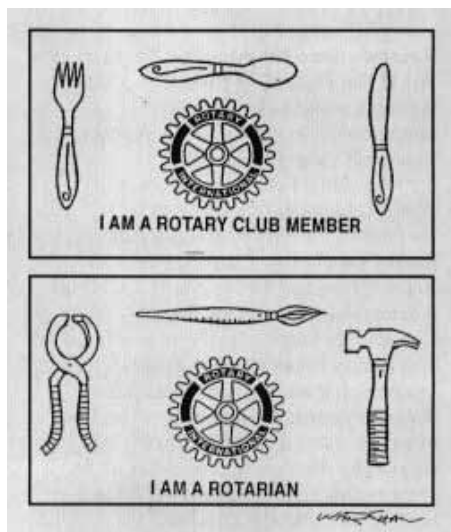
There is no age limit for being an organ donor.
