Michael gave the Club a tremendous insight into the wonderful work the "eyes for Africa" organisation does in providing eyesight to the most impoverished communities in Ethiopia. Michael showed us slides of the villages and the people who, in some cases, walked 200 K's to come to the clinic only to be told their optical condition did not allow his group to operate or repair the excessive damage.

Michael indicated that just for \$ 50 anyone could sponsor a cataract operation. Julie Tyers is the inspiration behind the organisation and leads an expedition to Ethiopia each year to carry out 200 operations. It was agreed that the club would try to get RAWCS involved in an attempt to get this organisation charitable status.
