As the start of the year we allocated \$10,000 towards the budget for International Service projects. There were so many worthy causes it was difficult to decide where the funds would be best used. There were floods in Pakistan, hurricanes, earthquakes, fires and finally the worst of all, the tsunami that destroyed most of northern Japan.

Our club provided Shelter boxes to Pakistan and chemically treated mosquito nets to the Solomon Islands and New Guinea.

Our club also allocated \$5,000 to Shelter box Australia and a possible further \$5,000 to Japan pending approval by the board and the members.

I wish to thank the Board members for their continued support, especially President Peter and Secretary Carolyn.

I look forward to our club's changeover dinner to be able to welcome the new board members.

COMMUNITY SERVICE REPORT

Driver Education and Behaviour Programme

Numerous meetings of the Programme Board met at Alan May Holden Ulladulla this year. It was decided to change from the Police Academy Driver Training School in Goulburn due to the high recruitment of Police Officers in training to new venue at Marulan Driver Training School at Goulburn.

The change meant an increase in fees we were charged, so we are seeking to increase Rotary and Lions financial contributions from \$1,000 to \$2,000 per year to cover the increases in costs to maintain this worthwhile community programme.

This year we attended Marulan Goulburn for the second successful year and it was extremely worthwhile as comments from students told us they were most impressed and learnt heaps re driver attitude with proactive skills harnessed on the 'skid pan' by all participants.

Bowelscan Programme

Most successful programme this year which is gathering momentum with every passing year, now that we are advertising in local newspapers. Over 500 participants this year. Results for our Districts 2010 Program; 144 persons were detected with Bowel Cancer or polyps! Another 164 'Positive' results are still pending investigation.

Helicopter Heli Pad

Hospital representatives have addressed our assembly re updates of this worthwhile project, our Helipad is in need of an 'urgent upgrade' to have greater access 24 hours a day in all weather conditions, as early arrival to receive specialist attention has significantly improved the saving of many lives.

We have had ongoing consultation with Government Departments as to who will foot the bill of upgrading. Private donations so far have made it possible to have new lighting installed for the choppers to now land safely at Milton helipad.

Christmas tree harvesting, delivery and sales

Personally I enjoyed the camaraderie, the most satisfying programme I have done in many years, learnt heaps. Thanks to Tim & Genelle Gregory, John Coburn, who made it all possible, assistants sales reps George Chittick, Brian Johnson, Brian & Jeni Wilkins, Bernie Cowley, Simon Brown, Trevor Schofield and Phil Brown, apology if I missed anyone.

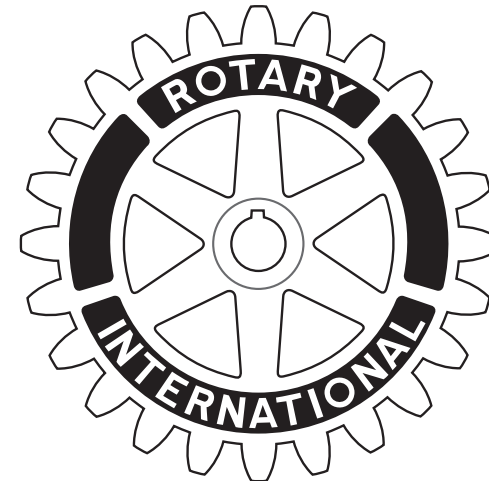

ROTARY CLUB OF MILTON ULLADULLA MOST IMPROVED STUDENT ULLADULLA PUBLIC SCHOOL

This is a new award which will be presented by Our club at the Ulladulla Public School End of Year Awards Night.

This is an award to encourage students from years 2, 3 and 4 to strive to do better in their studies, the younger age having been suggested by Paul Woodcock, the Headmaster of Ulladulla Primary School for two reasons:- a. It will encourage the student and give them confidence to work harder with their studies and b: - the school will benefit through a student who will reach greater achievements.

Teachers of classes within these age groups will each nominate a student, with the final student being chosen toward the end of the year. The prize is a cheque for \$150 to be held in the schools' trust account which can be accessed by the student's parents upon receipt for items such as school uniforms, books, equipment or school excursions.

PRIDE OF WORKMANSHIP AWARDS

This is an award which the Milton Ulladulla Rotary Club has previously participated in some years ago. The present board have discussed it and the brochure detailing the program has been passed on to the incoming board and the club as to whether we become involved in this program again.

YOUTH DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The past year has been a successful one for the Club with its involvement in the various youth programs. The budget for the year was \$8,600 of which only \$7,000 was invested in the youth of the local area. There were a number of programs in which the Club participated; these are listed below with a brief summary of the activity.

1. Rotary Youth Programme of ENrichment (RYPEN)

RYPEN is an experience aimed at younger teenagers to improve self esteem and to help develop leadership skills. There were two RYPEN camp held during the year, both were at Old Mogo Town. The first was in September 2010 and the Club sponsored one student (Grace Purvis) to attend. The second camp was held in May 2011. To this camp the club sponsored two students Andrew Henderson and Benjamin Wealleans. All students mad presentations to the Club upon their return with a very positive response from all.

2. Rotary Youth Exchange (RYE)

The club sponsored one inbound student from Sweden, Elin Ek. Elin arrived in July 2010 and returned to Sweden in June 2011. There were a number of host families that supported Elin during her stay in Australia. Elin attended the Ulladulla High School and was a frequent attendee at Club meetings. She became involved in The Entertainers and performed with that group at concerts in May 2011.

3. National Youth Science Forum (NYSF)

The club sponsored Tim Elton to attend the NYSF at the ANU Canberra. This forum is held during the University Christmas holidays and provides a live-in experience for students to sample sciences and engineering at the highest level. It is very difficult to win a position to attend this forum because competition is so great to fill the few positions that are available from year 11 students across Australia. Tim spoke to the club about his experiences on his return and impressed the members with his passion for science and the NYSF.

TREASURERS REPORT

This year is the first as a GST Registered Club and has led to a major change in the way the financial affairs of the Club are conducted.

The implementation of Tax Invoices for membership subscriptions would be the most visible to members and this intern has encouraged the earlier payment of fees. All monies collected at the weekly meetings are invoiced so as to account for the GST as are all other income and purchases, it also creates a paper trail that enables transparent and auditable dealings.

Our percentage of GST against total Rotary income is around 4% as several of our income streams are exempt GST as are donations made. Both the Blessing of the Fleet and Harbourfeast have tax office rulings separating them from the main Rotary accounts and no GST registration is required until their respective incomes exceed \$150,000.

The above figures are an estimation as final amounts will not be known till after 30th June 2011. The Blessing of the Fleet was a victim of the financial difficulties the community is suffering with only 27 Princesses instead of the normal 50.
