PRESIDENT'S REPORT

I have pleasure in presenting the report for the 52nd Annual Changeover of the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla Incorporated.

You can see by reading the reports of our Rotary Club Directors, it has been a year of intense activity.

I made three pledges as incoming President:

- 1 To keep 70% of expenditure local, as we have to answer to our sponsors and donors. That has been met with Eve Bosak's help.
- 2 With the Yellow Boat Road; \$100,000 would be raised from District 9710 toward Polio eradication. That has been met with the help of Clive Cross and Issa Shalhoub, with Safe Moneyboxes, in fact it has now gone worldwide.
- 3 To make Rotary more friendly for visitors, families, and spouses. This is an ongoing process.

Our club has sadly lost several committed members who have passed away or retired, and there is a real need to place more emphasis on membership recruitment and retention.

Throughout the year we have funded many projects and events, and made donations totaling \$41,705.00. The last of these is at my discretion to distribute tonight.

I have had the pleasure of working with Keith Bennett who always seems to be on the same page as me as Treasurer. Also Carolyn Campbell, who always keeps members well informed, together with a productive board of friendly directors.

Thank you sincerely to the many members who became my crutch of independence during my trying time of recuperation early in my term. Words can't explain my experience of kinship in the club.

I believe the club has successfully achieved its role in the community, and is in a strong financial position with good tone. I wish Michael and his board a year of fulfillment, and success for 2012-13.

INTERNATIONAL REPORT

Due to our Club's International Service Director Eve Bosak's health, I am submitting a report on her behalf. I served as a member on Eve's committee and my following report will not be as detailed as Eve would have submitted, but I am doing my best.

AIM:

International projects will be allocated 50% of my available funds and include working with our Anglican and Ulladulla High Schools to support a village in Cambodia in the areas of health, education and the empowerment of women. We will structure the project by way of taking advantage of D9710 matching funds. We will also support the "Eyes for Africa" Rotary foundation by donation, fundraising and voluntary service as required. We will maintain our ongoing RAM (Rotary Against Malaria) program, which began in 2004.

The other 50% of the allocated funds will be used for Disaster Relief and will include ShelterBoxes, food, access to clean water, clothing, equipment and general funding.

Worldwide Eradication of Polio; we will do what we can.
International toasting of a country at club meetings will be done regularly.

ACHIEVEMENTS:

All objectives have been met.

- We have spent \$8,000 on ShelterBoxes, and a further \$2,000 dedicated to the provision of two ShelterBoxes per annum to be used on a discretionary basis.
- We have had good success with our "Eyes for Africa", with \$1,000 being seeded for cataract replacement program in parts of Africa.
- We have spent \$1,000 on our RAM's ongoing project to protect another village in the Solomon's.
- The Eradication of Polio Worldwide project using our printed Safe Moneybox is achieving great success.
- The "Breakfast for Cambodian" is a great success story. Sustainable Cambodia Fund which will provide 360 preschoolers with high protein meals. Our Club will donate \$2,000 with a matching grant from District Fund for the same amount and \$1,000 from Rotary Foundation, this program has been linked with a club in Western Australia.
- Weekly International toasts at our meetings have been well accepted.

A Taiwan Rotary Friendship Exchange took place on 29 February to 2 March 2012. The exchange was made of ten members and we hosted them.

A great deal of effort in terms of correspondence and detailed negotiations at various high Rotary levels was put in and achieved very worthwhile results.

I strongly urge the Club to maintain all of these projects well into the future. I am proud to say we have had a very successful year and we all wish Eve a speedy recovery.

YOUTH DIRECTOR'S REPORT

The past year has been a successful one for the Club with its involvement in various youth programs. The budget for the year was \$4,800 of which only \$4,400 was invested in the youth of the local area. There were a number of programs in which the Club participated; these are listed below with a brief summary of the activity.

1. **Rotary Youth Programme of Enrichment (RYPEN)**

RYPEN is an experience aimed at younger teenagers to improve self esteem and to help develop leadership skills. There were two RYPEN camps held during the year, both were at Old Mogo Town. The first was in September 2011 and the Club sponsored one student, Alex Gomez, to attend. The second camp was held in May 2012. To this camp the club sponsored three students Kristina Wilkins, James Cox and Maggie Purvis. The students made presentations to the Club upon their return with a very positive response from members.

2. **Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA)**

The club sponsored one student to attend RYLA 2012 - Jessica Fricke. This six day residential Program offers participants the opportunity to enhance their personal development and leadership potential. Jessica spoke to the Club members upon her return from RYLA

3. **Year 9 Outward Bound Foundations Course 2012.**

Three year 9 students from Ulladulla High School were sponsored to attend this Outward Bound Course which is held at the Namadgi National Park in the ACT from 26 May to 1 June 2012. The sponsored students were: Jordan Murray; Lachlan Maher; and Bodhi Morgan. There were 32 students from Ulladulla that attended the course, which was designed to improve self esteem, develop resilience and responsibility as well as to challenge individuals and teams to overcome difficulties.

4. **National Youth Science Forum (NYSF)**

The club has sponsored Brianna Payten to attend the NYSF at the ANU Canberra. This forum is held during the University Christmas holidays and provides a live-in experience for students to sample sciences and engineering at the highest level. It is very difficult to win a position to attend this forum because competition is so great to fill the few positions that are available from year 11 students across Australia. We hope that Brianna has success in winning a place on the NYSF 2012.

5. Support for Ulladulla High School to attend the South Coast HSC Study Day held in Bega. The Club contributed toward the cost of sending HSC students to Bega to attend this one day seminar.

6. **Honeywell Engineering Summer School 2012 (HESS)**

One student (Joseph Meehan) from Ulladulla High School has been sponsored to attend this week long seminar. The HESS will be held from 2 to 7 December 2012 and the students will be accommodated at the Macquarie University campus, North Ryde.

TREASURER'S REPORT

This is the first year as a Level 1 Community Service Charity, which required a major change in our financial reporting requirements to Fair Trading.

As the year progressed it became evident that sponsorship and public participation in our various events would become harder to obtain as the effects of the global economic situation became evident and this is reflected in the fall of \$20,000 in the gross Rotary income and to a lesser extent the lower than anticipated Harbourfeast income.

On the bright side the commencement of the Charity Housie (cash bingo) in conjunction with the Mollymook Golf Club has proved to be great success for the Sunday sessions, but the Thursday sessions have only had moderate participation and will cease at the end of June
