Guest Speaker Beck

Cameron, spoke on her time in 2001 with her husband Grant Schultz, during a posting to the United Nations Mission in East Timor, to provide assistance with law and order when East Timor gained independence, now renamed Timor Leste.

During their time in Timor Leste, Beck and husband Grant visited the Santa Clara Orphanage, which is situated in Bairo Pite - the poorest suburb of one of the poorest and newest nations in the world. The orphanage is run by a small group of Franciscan Nuns and was and still is in need of help, they continued weekly visits to the orphanage and provided support and assistance for eight months.

The "Friends of Santa Clara", a support group, was started by Grant and Beck in 2001, they continued their support during additional postings in 2004-2005 and again in 2006, and have visited since on several occasions because the orphans need help, Timorese children rank amongst the highest infant mortality rates in the world, many die from preventable conditions such as measles and parasite infestation.

Ongoing financial support is needed to provide decent food, healthcare and education for the children and Sisters as well as the provision of a garden and livestock to assist with self sufficiency. More assistance to Timor Leste is provided through the United Nations, Australian Government, and non government organisations including Rotary.

Beck and husband Grant are now retired sergeants, and Beck runs the 'Merchants of Milton' store selling third world countries products.
