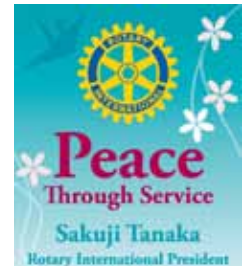

A Rotary Youth Exchange student, will spend up to a year living with host families. Students are sent to another country generally living with multiple host families during the year and being expected to perform daily tasks within the household as well as attend school in the host country.



Students will learn a new way of living, a great deal about themselves, and maybe even a new language. They will also be an ambassador, teaching people they meet about their country, culture, and ideas. They can help bring the world closer – and make some good friends in the process.

For over 75 years, students and host families have broadened their horizons through Rotary Youth Exchange. More than 80 countries and over 8,000 students each year participate in the program, which is administered at the regional level by Rotary districts and at the local level by Rotary clubs.
