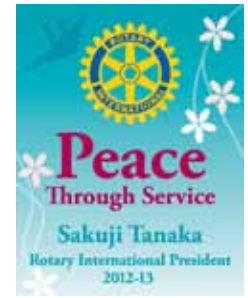

Guest Speakers Grant Schultz and Jim Thomas, from very different life experiences addressed the Club.

Grant Schultz was born in Melbourne and has been involved in policing with National Commonwealth police force. He has served in Cyprus where Australian police are well respected. Grant has also has ben seconded to East Timor on two occasions. Here he was involved with police training of the East Timor police and riot control.

Jim Thomas was born in London after World War II and remembers the aftermath of damage brought to London and to Brixton. Since retiring and coming to this district he enjoys gardening, fishing and working with Rotary.
