District Governor - Maureen Manning (RC of Batemans Bay)



Maureen's Rotary journey started in the Rotary Club of Lower Blue Mountains (District 9690) in June 2000, where she was the Youth Director for two years; during this time she chartered a new Rotaract Club. Maureen also served District 9690 as Secretary of the RYLA and RYPEN Committees for two years.

Maureen and her partner, Stephen Daniel, have been together for ten years. Stephen retired after 27 years of Navy service—20 years in Canada and seven in Australia. In mid-2003, Maureen and Stephen decided to move to Mogo on the NSW south coast. Maureen works as a Property Manager in BB, while Stephen has a woodworking business in Mogo.

Rotary continued to be an important part of Maureen's life when she transferred to the Rotary Club of Batemans Bay in October 2003. She served the Club as its President (2005–06 and 2007–08) and has been Director of the Youth, Club Service and Membership portfolios.

Maureen was appointed a District 9710 Assistant Governor in 2008 and has served on the RYPEN, Membership and Club Visioning Committees and was the Service Projects Director in 2011–12.

In her local community, Maureen has been the Vice President of the Chamber of Commerce, Vice President of Women in Business and President of Dream & Achieve. Maureen and Stephen share her four children and six grandchildren.

District Governor Elect - Rowley Tompsett (RC of Hall)



Rowley was inducted into the RC of Ginninderra in 2006 as the Director responsible for the new satellite Club of Mitchell Gungahlin. However, he has served community organisations for over 40 years, both as a volunteer and as a professional administrator.

Rowley served the Royal Life Saving Society in WA as its Executive Director between 1977 and 1983 and the Scout Association in WA as its Administrative Officer for four years. He has also been a Director of Hockey Associations in the ACT and Western Australia and was Chairman of the Australia Defence Force Hockey Association. Rowley was Hockey Australia's Country Commissioner for six years. Rowley was sworn as a Justice of the Peace in the ACT Supreme Court in 2003.

In his Rotary career, Rowley has served his Clubs as Charter President, Director Satellite Club, Director Public Relations and in a number of Committee positions. At District he has been an Assistant Governor, District Rotaract Chair, District Membership Chair, Club Vision Facilitator and has edited the DG's Newsletter on three occasions. He was awarded Key Rotarian in 2011. The Rotary Club of Gungahlin recognised Rowley as a Paul Harris Fellow in 2010. He is also member of the Paul Harris Society, a Benefactor of The Rotary Foundation and a member of the International Fellowship of Rotary Editors and Publishers.

Rowley retired from full-time service in the Royal Australian Air Force at the end of 2011. He and Denise share four children and nine grandchildren. Retired from the Australian Public Service, Denise has a small cookware business, The Chefs Toolbox. While Rowley's passion is Rotary, Denise, a Charter Member of two Rotary Clubs, is now a member of Zonta International. Rowley and Denise have retired in Canberra and enjoy fine dining and wine, classical music, jazz, theatre, opera and, most recently, caravanning. Both are also members of Canberra Legacy.
