PP Craig Cameron addressed the Club and spoke of his recent trip to Peru last April as part of a group of optometrists, doctors and ophthalmic surgeons. The trip was part of a follow up trip to check on and treat the sight of many of the villagers in Chivay including cataracts and pterygiums' surgery.

Part of the trip was sponsored by Australians. A group of Peace Volunteers from the USA helped to interpret and taught general hygiene to the villagers.

Craig presented a few slides of life in the village of Chivay, the difficulties in preparing hygienic surroundings for operations. They also had to cope with the rarefied atmosphere at nearly five thousand meters above sea level.

All equipment and medications had to be carried in and accounted for by Customs Officers when leaving Australia and arriving in Peru. The equipment and drugs also had to be accounted for when they left Peru.

Craig also spoke of the work done in developing an orphanage in the village of Chivay.

It was very pleasing to see the numbers of village people who had confidence in the work of the group and presented themselves to have surgery and treatment. The members congratulated Craig on his work and interest was generated in perhaps the Club may be able to financially support this work in the future.
