Guest Speaker; Andrew Humphreys works at the hospital and youth services. He spoke of the suicides of young people. Andrew suggested that mental problems became much worse after the 1960 with the introduction of barbiturates.

Andrew cited examples that suggested that the closure of Victorian Tech School left many lower socio-economic students without training for their future life as young adults. He felt that trade training was vital for the training of these young people. The lack of opportunities to advance young people's training, the removal of some support benefits may cause social distress. These and other factors may affect the transition of young people into the adult world. I has been known for some time that people may feel that they have no place in the world.

It is not common knowledge but suicide numbers outstrips motor accidents.

Andrew spoke of depression as an illness. As such, it may not necessarily respond to pills as they may not get to the root cause of the depression. They may not address the causes such as rural drought, financial difficulties, separations, loss of jobs that may affect the economic base of a family.

Suicide does affect children. Children never get over the loss of family member. The love for mothers or fathers cannot be replaced by anything that might be available.

In a report Andrew stated that gambling related suicides has increased and this issue and others must be addressed.
