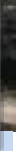

**Guest speaker Jordan Maloney** works as a chiropractor at Berry and also in Milton.



Chiropractors are now not only concerned with back and neck problems but also with knees and soft tissue injuries. These injuries may occur during work or when playing contact sports. Jordan is also concerned in injuries that affect muscle balance as well as neurological problems caused by injuries.

In some cases Jordan can advise on methods that will help you to overcome some types of injuries.

Jordan spoke of the kinesiology strip tapes that are worn by athletes to help in the rehabilitation of injuries, help blood flow and relieve pain.

Extra training is required if chiropractors wish to work with animals such as horses or dogs.

Jordan has purchased the squash courts

in Ulladulla and is very interested in developing it as a community resource again. Jordan handled a very lively question and answer session that reflected great interest in his work.

### **Message from Clive Cross regarding our Club's Polio Eradication Safe MoneyBoxes:**

We started our Moneybox project in October 2011 and we had four major objectives:

- 1. Take it to our community --> done with much success.**
- 2. Take it to our district--> done with much success initially but fell away in 2012.**  
Lack of District 9710 support and promotion of Polio Pin for district.
- 3. Take it to the nation --> done with much success. At least three other districts have taken it on.**
- 4. Take it to the world --> happening now through the 2014 RI Convention in Sydney.**

Some 4,000 of our moneyboxes will play a huge role at the Convention which will be attended by around 40,000 Rotarians from around the world.

There will be at least 4,000 Rotary Soldiers (Safe Moneyboxes) standing in homes and offices, around the world, quietly collecting money for the eradication of this diabolic disease.

I reckon they will earn in excess of \$50,000 with little or no effort by anybody.

Members may be asked to do some work at the convention and I will keep everybody informed.

All I can say for now is that we keep moneyboxes here in Ulladulla until about a few weeks before the convention as they have nowhere to store them in Sydney now. I will get in touch with **Peter Hughes** who is thankfully transporting and storing them.

The thing is that we, our little old club, your club, has found a way to the Rotary International World Stage. We can all be very proud of that simple fact.
