Card Raffle winner was Rob Powell 6♦.

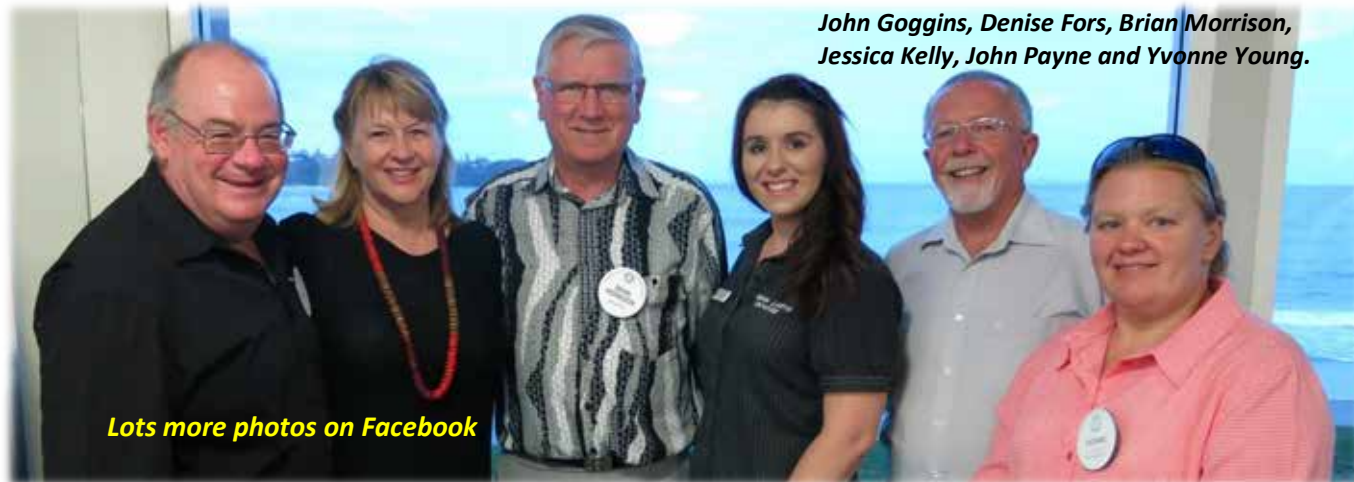
Guest Speaker Jessica Kelly has been selected to attend a Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA).
