Members, partners and friends met at shop 10 in Rowen's Arcade, the new home of the 'Gondwana Coast Fossil Walk' group which is made up of a team of enthusiastic local volunteers.

Phil Smart gave us a talk and a power point presentation and said that Ulladulla is a unique tourist destination amongst a beautiful natural harbour with the Pigeon House as a stunning backdrop.

The Gondwana Coast Fossil Walk Project, concept developed by Phil Smart, conducted the first walk in November 2009. The walks were planned to be conducted all year round, and put Ulladulla on the map through geotourism with the support of the Ulladulla Milton Lions Club. Since then it has been rebranded as the Gondwana Coast Fossil Walk.

In 2010 the group acquired their first home which was a shop front in the Fisherman's Co-op and was officially opened by the then Mayor Paul Green. That site had a reception area, a museum with fossils displays, posters and maps.

In November 2011 to October 2013 the group moved to their second home at the Harbour and this time they also had seatings for presentations, till the fire occurred. Glenn Rowen then offered the group a rent free shop in Rowen's Arcade.

Phil Smart thanked the following for their sponsorship since 2009; the Shoalhaven City Council, Geoscience Australia, NSW Geological Survey, Ulladulla Printing Service and Crystal World. Phil also thanked the local support and sponsorship of Rowen's Arcade, Joe Pirrello, Richard Walpole, Bunnings Warehouse, Ulladulla Glass, Hampton Hire, Ulladulla 3D Paint and Colour, Stephen Shipton from Signtext, and three volunteer organisations; Milton-Ulladulla U3A, Ulladulla Milton Lions Club and the Ulladulla Marine Rescue.

The group now is looking for a new home at the Harbour hopefully with the help of government and corporate sponsorships and the support of Service Clubs and the local community.



After the presentation we all gathered at the Rotary Park where Phil talk us on the Brodie Park Time Walk, a walk through the geological history of the Shoalhaven.

The 255 meter walk along landscaped rock gardens, traverses the 270 million year old rocks that form the rock platforms on the south side of Ulladulla Harbour.

In the absence of signage, free flyers are available at the beginning of the walk and are located in a letter box, they provide explanations and outline the significance of each bolder along the walk.



The talk and Time Walk were followed by a BBQ kindly organised by Tony Fondacaro and cooked to perfection by Phil Brown, Dom and Tony Fondacaro and was enjoyed along with a beverage by all.
