Members wished **Alf Rowen** a Happy Birthday.

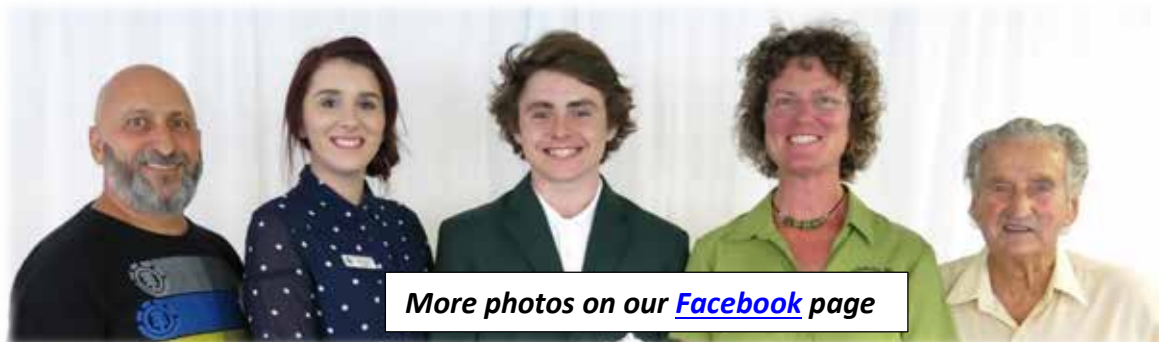

Guest Speaker Luke Brimacombe is now in year 12, and thanked our Club for sending him last December to the Honeywell Engineering Summer School (HESS), which is a weeklong live-in program and is aimed at year 11 NSW and ACT students. The students visit 5 engineering universities, industry site tours and are provided with the opportunity to talk one-on-one with engineers at a careers expo.

HESS is an Engineers Australia Sydney Division initiative supported by Honeywell, NSW 'Engineering' Universities and participating Rotary Districts, and this year was hosted by the University of NSW. The principal aim of HESS is to give NSW and ACT high school students a better understanding of what engineering is and how it works in everyday life, as well as the ability to visit engineering universities to aid in their selection of university.

The 2013 HESS brought together 100 Year 11 students from across NSW and ACT. 80% of the students were from regional areas. Luke was unsure about which path to follow after year 12, but he now feels that he has a better knowledge in selecting a career.



Guest Speaker Jessica Kelly spoke on her experience with attending the Rotary Youth Leadership Award (RYLA) seminar in Canberra last January. **RYLA, a Rotary program, is a seven day residential leadership seminar for aspiring young leaders, keen to exercise their leadership potential, participate in a range of formal and informal activities, which promote leadership skills.**

Jessica said 'it was one of the best weeks of your life, it changes you in so many ways, your values become stronger, your outlook on everything changes, and you open yourself up into a whole new world of different experiences, it changes you as a person'.

The week included seminars, lectures and activities that participants attended. Speakers included Kate Lundy and Virginia Haussegger, a reporter and presenter of the ABC's "7:30 Report". Virginia was brought in to teach us about Communications and presentation techniques.

At RYLA, we were shown into the world of Rotary, and what Rotary offers nationally and internationally.
