Guest Speakers: Shoalhaven City Councillors **Patricia White** and **Allan Baptist** were the guest speakers, they spoke on Ward 3 Achievements in 2013, which included \$20 million of development in our area, such as Matron Porter Drive - Garside Rd water mains, Ulladulla Civic Centre upgrade, Harbour Boardwalk, Matron Porter

Drive Sealing, Milton Mollymook cycleway, Leisure Centre additions, Mollymook Surf Life Saving Club rebuild and the Netball Court upgrade West Ulladulla.

The councillors spoke on the Key Development Approvals such as Mollymook Heights, Lucas Development at Sussex Inlet and Tallwood Ave Motel and Conference facilities in Mollymook.

Patricia and Allan also reported on the assistance given to organisations like the Ulladulla Garden Club, Milton Ulladulla Historical Society, Milton Show Society, the Dunn and Lewis Association and the Community Radio.



Amongst the 2013 City based achievements mentioned on the night were the Berry Bypass, Nowra Bridge placement and design underway and the South Nowra dual highway which is now completed.

The 2014 goals yet to be budgeted and talked about, include a basketball court at Rotary Park, Porters Creek Dam, cycle ways and pathways, marina for Ulladulla, completion of the Dunn Lewis Centre and roads upgrades.

In 2009, we asked thousands of Rotarians to weigh in on Rotary’s future. The following year, the Rotary International Board of Directors adopted a strategic plan with three priorities that directly reflect the Rotarians’ responses:

**Support and
strengthen clubs**

**Focus and increase
humanitarian service**

**Enhance public image
and awareness**

When we surveyed another random sample of members in 2012, Rotarians expressed strong support for these three strategic priorities and endorsed the goals under each priority at a rate of more than 95 percent.

Through **fellowship**, we build lifelong relationships that promote greater global understanding.

With **integrity**, we honour our commitments and uphold ethical standards.

Our **diversity** enables us to connect different perspectives and approach problems from many angles.

We apply our **vocational expertise, service, and leadership** to tackle some of the world’s greatest challenges.
