Guest Speaker was Paul Warren, who is the President of the Milton Ulladulla RSL Sub Branch, spoke on the Anzac Spirit and also gave a brief summary on his life in the Navy.

Paul gave a short biography of William Wood, who was born about 1788. At the age of 16 he joined the 2nd battalion of the 95th Regiment (the Rifle Corps). The 2/95th saw considerable action with varying success. In 1807, they fought the Spanish at Monte Video. In 1808, they had to retreat from Napoleon's army at Corunna in North West Spain and, in 1809, they also had to retreat after the Walcheren Expedition in the Netherlands.

William Wood came to Australia and his biography can be linked to a part of the heritage of the Anzac Spirit.

As for Paul Warren, he was a sea cadet in Wollongong, then he joined the Navy in 1972 at the age of 15 and a half and left in 1991. During that time he did a communication course and an electronic warfare at HMAS Watson in Sydney.

Paul has spent eight years at sea, and at 24 years of age he was a Chief Petty Officer, one of the youngest in the Service at that time. Paul enjoyed his time in the Navy and hopes to see an end to all wars, a view shared by all members of the Club.
