Guest Speaker: Peter Campbell gave an interesting talk about his recent bicycle trip along the south coast of Victoria. Bike rides are not new to Peter as he has been involved in cycling in New Zealand and Tasmania.

It was fascinating to think of the logistics involved in the organization of such a ride that involved 5,000 riders.

The ride commenced at the Blue Lake near Mt Gambier in South Australia and finished in Geelong. Each leg was approximately 100km a day with rest days were included.
