The Club recently sent four Ulladulla High School students to a life changing youth camp, **RYPEN**. (The Rotary Youth Program of Enrichment.) This program communicates to teenagers (14 - 17 years) a series of ideas, problems and social experiences which will assist them in forming their own values and normal standards. Nominees from the Rotary Club **Coen Thompson, Tannar Findley, Molly Haughey and Kyle Penny** stepped out of their comfort zones once again and addressed the Club individually.

All students agreed that the bush dancing and talent quest were a highlight. **Coen Thompson** was happy to have thirty new Facebook friends and really enjoyed the social aspect of the camp. He remembered the ice-cream face challenge as a crazy and fun thing.

Tannar Findley thought the camp, which took place at Mogo town, was a great opportunity to grow in confidence and self-esteem, as well as meet new people from different schools and make new friends. She especially liked the dreamtime stories with Uncle around the camp fire. Tannar listed other activities she participated in such as, Am I so Different?, Trivia, Tug of War, Mind Body Soul, Intuitive games, 10 Topics in 45 minutes and Can't See - So What, a presentation from a blind lady. Tannar revealed that leadership skills were definitely enhanced along her journey. The ice-breaker game of string and spoon through sleeves, then CD back the other way was a huge hit.

Molly Haughey spoke of lasting memories and of being out of her comfort zone in the beginning. She quickly relaxed after finding the other attendees really friendly. Molly enjoyed the food and the camp's program. She spoke about team work and leadership skill activities, as well as a discussion about the issues the youth face at present.



Kyle Penny told the Club that he would recommend the RYPAN program to anyone, saying "It was the best camp ever!" He made many new friends and learnt to appreciate more of the things in his life. He took away new strategies for memorising things, more of an insight into mental health issues and a new outlook on life. All students thanked our Club, Milton Ulladulla Taxis, Ms Hackett and Yvonne Young for making this worthwhile event happen.

Michael Mastronardi informed the club of the recent pledge of \$3,000 from local government for the Driver Awareness Program.

Terry Marchello reminded members of the upcoming Business Awards this Friday night and urged Rotarians to purchase a ticket from the ExServo's.

Leonie Smith gave the Club some statistics from the Ulladullirious Comedy Festival. 27 Committee members received Cert'3 in Tourism, 100 hours of work placement was completed by Ulladulla High School Students, 1,000 people registered to attend the different events, over 1/2 of those who attended shopped locally, 54% of festival goers dined out at least once during the festival, 1/3 of attendees were couples, In excess of \$175,000 was spent across the region during Ulladullirious, 100% of venues confirmed an increased turnover compared to weeks before and after the festival and all performers/acts said they had a great time and would come back again.
