The school aims to meet the specific needs of the children to help them to obtain life skills. Sheryl said that she and the staff always marvelled at how children responded to these challenges.

Teachers are specially trained to gather evidence for teaching their students. Research strategies that teach students skills that will be important to them in later life. Many students respond to individual lessons. Communication is very important and the aids may be visual, oral or both. Interactive equipment such as white board and iPads are great inventions for students.
