Guest Speakers; Jake Adlam from the Shoalhaven Anglican School and **David Robertson** from the Ulladulla High School addressed the Club, they spoke on their experiences after attending the National Youth Science Forum.

At the Forum which was held in January this year, Jake and David were hosted by a local Rotarians who played mums and dads for around 400 students from all over Australia and even some international students, and helped anyone who feels homesick or any general issues.

Jake and Adam said that they expected the Forum, which went for thirteen days in Canberra, to have a lot of talking and not much doing, to be enjoyable and informative but not life changing, and a bit awkward due to presence of so many nerds, low key, formal and relaxed.

But they were surprised to find the Forum to be a hundred times better than what they thought, a lot of doing and a lot of talking, very inclusive and very social, they met amazing people, had amazing lab visits and lectures, they worked with staff who had infinite energy, attended lots of social events and they found the Forum to be Life Transforming!

David's favourite experience was a Skype Conference with CERN laboratory which sits astride the Franco-Swiss border near Geneva, the name CERN is derived from the acronym for the French "Conseil Européen pour la Recherche Nucléaire". David had numerous lab visits including Research School of Physics, Mt Stromlo Observatory, School of Physics, ANU Supercomputer and the School of Earth Sciences and he attended lots of lectures on Quantum Physics, Nanoscience and ethics forum and Forensic Chemistry.

Jake and his group visited the NASA Satellite Tracking Station Tipenbila, Mount Majura Winery, Murray Darling Basin Authority, Cowra Fossil Dig and Research School for Earth Sciences and attended lectures on consciousness in flies, Science and Ethics and one on drugs.

Jake and David also joined in extra activities including impromptu and partnered speeches to improve their communication skills, the staff gave presentations on life after school, goal setting, University and body language and afternoon activities like sunset up at Black Mountain.

Jake said that he will remember the life changing and eye opening lab visits, the confidence he gained in choosing his career path, the incredibly awkward first day, the incredibly sad last day and all the friends he made for life. David said that the Forum confirmed his interests in studying science at university and that ANU will be his university of choice, the Forum also boosted his confidence and it created a great network of friends and opened a lot of doors.

Jake and David concluded their presentation by thanking our Club and said 'We are unable to thank you enough for your more than generous support' and a special thank you from both students went to Yvonne Young for her help.
