**Guest Speakers David Robertson and Richard Nesbitt;**

Ulladulla High School student **David Robertson** spoke passionately on the fast approaching International Youth Science Forum, 'IYSF', in London. David is one of twenty five Australian students chosen to attend this prestigious event in July this year. A total of four hundred students from around the world aged between 17 and 24 and mostly university students undertaking science studies will attend the Imperial College of London for two weeks. The comprehensive program will feature Nobel Peace Prize works, as well as a visit to the UK Palace and factories, followed by a trip to France and Switzerland where students will visit the CERN laboratory which sits astride the Franco-Swiss border near Geneva, where over three thousand scientists will be featured on the program.

In conjunction with some grants being received to attend the Forum, David has started fundraising to make up the difference of the \$12,000 total cost. David is currently seeking fundraising ideas to reach the total cost such as a trivia, movie night and raffles. Any donations towards David's cost are tax deductible. Although the 'IYSF' is taking place in July 2015, David has until October 2015, to raise the money needed to attend. We wish David much success in reaching his goal.



**Richard Nesbitt** spoke of a plan to build an outdoor half-court basketball facility adjacent to the Mollymook Surf Club. The project appears to be an excellent addition to the play area at Mollymook. Richard is a solicitor who lived and worked in our area from 1982 to 1992, then moved to Canberra and now has returned to retire in Mollymook.

Because of health and safety issues outside groups are no longer able to use school facilities, Richard was able to give the specifications of the court as well as speak on the development of the project.

Richard and the Milton-Ulladulla Basket-Ball Association have spent some 18 months into the planning of this project which has gained the Shoalhaven City Council approval and support.

Richard sees it as a community facility that will be able to offer opportunity for people of all ages and gender to practice their skills as well as play in three a side competitions, three on three, anytime of the day and will be accessible by wheel chair.

Richard estimates that the project will cost approximately \$50,000 and that two thirds of the cost have already been received by the Council and the State Government for this community project. Richard is asking our Club and community members to help finance the balance of this venture.
