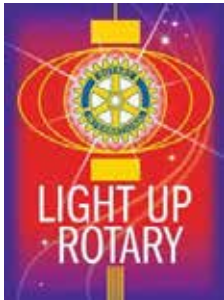

INTERNATIONAL REPORT

Rotary year 2014-15 saw Eve Bosak take up the role of International Service Director, continuing her long-standing commitment to her International Services objectives. Unfortunately, Eve's life circumstances changed resulting in her leaving the Rotary community mid-way through the year. As her erstwhile understudy, I took over as International Director, continuing Eve's original plans for the year, without her skills and familiarity with Rotary ways, but with the backing of the Board, we carried on.

Ongoing support continued for the longstanding worldwide programme for the eradication of polio through our unique **Money Box project** managed by President Elect Clive Cross, it is worth noting that the little money boxes have now spread throughout Rotary International and continue to contribute to the funding of the very successful project to **eradicate polio** worldwide.

Our Club's relationship with the **Eyes for Africa Project** carried on throughout the year with Project Management transitioning from Eve to myself and incorporating the new RAWCS fiscal management service. We were also fortunate to receive a heart-warming presentation by Julie Tyers, founder, and local coordinator Michael van Ewijk on the project's work.

Unfortunately, during the year natural disasters in Vanuatu and Nepal dominated the Board's consideration of international expenditure resulting in significant donations to **ShelterBox** and **Disaster Aid Australia** to provide shelters and basic facilities to those in need.

Our relationship with the **Rotarians Against Malaria (RAM)** project was re-established through Ron Seddon as project manager of the Adopt a Village Project, distributing mosquito nets to villages in Papua New Guinea. I would recommend to the incoming International Director that this relationship and ongoing support of the RAM Project continue in the coming year.

Sponsorship was also provided to **Interplast Australia and New Zealand** to assist with providing volunteer medical experts in providing life changing surgery and training of local doctors and nurses in developing countries. I also recommend to the incoming Director that he explore a stronger relationship with Turia Pitt to continue our club's support for Interplast.

During the year, **Timor Leste** emerged as a candidate for our Club's involvement, potentially, in conjunction with either the Bendigo Sandhurst or Tuggeranong Rotary clubs. This potential for a relationship between our club and other clubs to benefit Timor Leste should continue to be investigated in the New Year.

In closing, I would like to thank and congratulate all the members of the Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla for their outstanding efforts throughout the year in raising the funds needed for the international actions the board has taken on their behalf.

In January 2015 David Robertson was successful in applying to attend the International Youth Science Programme in London July 2015. In February Jake Adlam was selected to be a NSYF camp leader for the 2016 Canberra only four from the 2015 NSYF were selected.

May 2015 RYPEN camp 4 students applying to attend. All students enjoying themselves at the camp. Students have been invited to attend a dinner in June 2015.

In June we have had the honour of three students to apply for NSYF.

In 2014-15 the club has supported Youth projects totalling over \$7,000.00
