Guest Speakers:

New member talk – Emile Jansen entertained us with insights to his life covering his proposal to Shelagh in the snow, 40 years of racing a Porsche, an architecture practice spanning city, overseas and country living. A life of designing homes, business buildings and large public building projects. Emile shared his long list of professional recognitions as well as his Service Above Self award for his contribution to the enhancement of Mona Vale Hospital. Members present welcomed Emile and Shelagh enthusiastically.



Guest Speaker – Vicky Turay, standing in for Mark Brantingham, spoke about the Yumaro Industries organisation that operates the Mallala nursery and cardboard recycling business near the Ulladulla Tennis Courts. Yumaro provides employment and training for people with disabilities in the South Coast Area. Yumaro employs 33 people in Ulladulla, 65 in Moruya with some 30 support staff. While the Australian Government provides funds, their business activity relies heavily on local businesses where Yumaro competes in an open market place.

Mallala Nursery is the business that members will be most familiar with through our regular support. Vicky updated us with Yumaro's intention to raise funds, \$100,000 for new equipment, as part of a move the cardboard recycling part of the business to Wilfords Lane. Yumaro will expand overall operations to secure document destruction, lawn mowing, textiles & embroidery, survey pegs, cleaning cloth and training to encourage independent living and has employed a marketer to assist. Vicky invited business owners to consider Yumaro as a potential business partner in the future.
