Peter explained how he volunteered for gardening at Cancer House, then in 2016 become President of the Management committee for the Cancer outpatients appeal.

Peter gave a brief history of the Cancer House at Milton Ulladulla Hospital. It come about after Doctors in the area saw a gap in need, for people with cancer and having chemotherapy treatment and the travelling that patients did, and having them closer to home for treatment. The cancer house started in 2008. The Cancer outpatients appeal assistance with the daily running, resources, and training of staff in the Cancer House. The management committee met quarterly, to maintain the running of the centre.

The cancer house is currently fundraising for a palliative care unit to be built at Milton Ulladulla Hospital. The aim is to have a palliative care unit with a family room and amenities for families to be able to stay with their loved one at the end stage. Tenders have closed for the building and hoping to build this year.

The Cancer Outpatients appeal are having a fundraiser one being a barefoot bowls on 1/4, cost \$100.00 per team and a golf day on 2/9. More details to follow on both events.

Peter thanked the Milton Ulladulla Rotary Club for the assistance the club has given to the Cancer Outpatients Appeal over the years.

### "RECRUITING NEW MEMBERS CAN BE EASY"

In an ideal world recruiting a new Rotarian would be a simple matter. You would simply ask the person if he or she would like to join Rotary. Unfortunately, it is not as easy as that. There is always the fear that the person might say no and the feeling of rejection and humiliation can be as strong as the feeling of jubilation should the person say yes.



Certainly there are people who have no problem asking a friend, colleague or acquaintance straight out, but those people are a rare breed.

Many clubs hold Rotary membership nights, but even that requires a face-to-face ask.

Over the past few years the Rotary Club of Yass, NSW, has come up with a formula for such an evening which, if followed exactly, guarantees new members, without having to personally ask.

We follow the idea of an information night, but there are certain steps we take that make the whole process much easier for everyone.

Our tips:

- Ask members to submit names and addresses of anyone they think would make a good Rotarian.
- Send an invitation from the president by mail (not email).
- Keep the evening informal, cocktail party rather than a meal, and NO GUEST SPEAKER (they have come to hear about Rotary)!
- Organise three or four Rotarians to tell their Rotary stories in a few minutes each. Have varied topics such as what happens at meetings, club projects, Polio Plus, overseas opportunities, etc.
- As the guests leave give them something to take away (e.g. a brochure on the club).
- FOLLOW UP! Have someone contact them the next day to invite them to the next normal meeting.
