Report:

President Clive Cross welcomed our guest speaker, Peter Anderson.

International Director **Cliff Workman** proposed a toast to RAMS as the previous day was International Malaria Day. **Pres Clive** updated members with some of the clubs 5 year history of involvement in the RAMS project and the Club's sponsorship of villages in PNG to supply anti mosquito nets and clean-up standing water.

Past President Brian Morrison introduced our guest speaker, Peter Anderson. Peter has been town only 18 months arriving after his wife began practicing in the area as a rural GP. There is something in the air here as there are now three Andersons following the birth of a daughter.

Peter provided us with a little of his history prior to joining our community, having worked in Ireland and Sydney he sees significant growth of integrated natural health practices with traditional medicine. As a result, he has joined with herbalist Fiona Stephens, to organise a Natural Health Expo on Saturday afternoon May 28th as a means of bringing together local natural health professionals and the public. Peter's anecdotes were persuasive that there is unlikely to be a one-stop-solution for improving our general health. Peter often sees treatment being referred, as appropriate, across Herbalist, Naturopathy, Chiro, Massage, Pilates, Physio, Hypnotherapy, Podiatry, Yoga, Acupuncture, Osteo, Nutrition, Personal Training or Exercise Physiology practitioners for the best outcome for his patients.



Peter invited members (those not volunteering at the swap Meet set-up) to come to the Expo on the 28th and see the range of natural health services that is available locally.

In closing the meeting Pres Clive praised the local Garden Club for their continuing support of our Polio Money Boxes.

Members also received a heads-up on a new community newspaper being put together that is intended to fill the gaps being left by the changes at the Milton-Ulladulla Times.
