Visiting Rotarian **Herman de Vries** spoke on Rotary Club of Swan Districts projects including sustainable Cambodia.

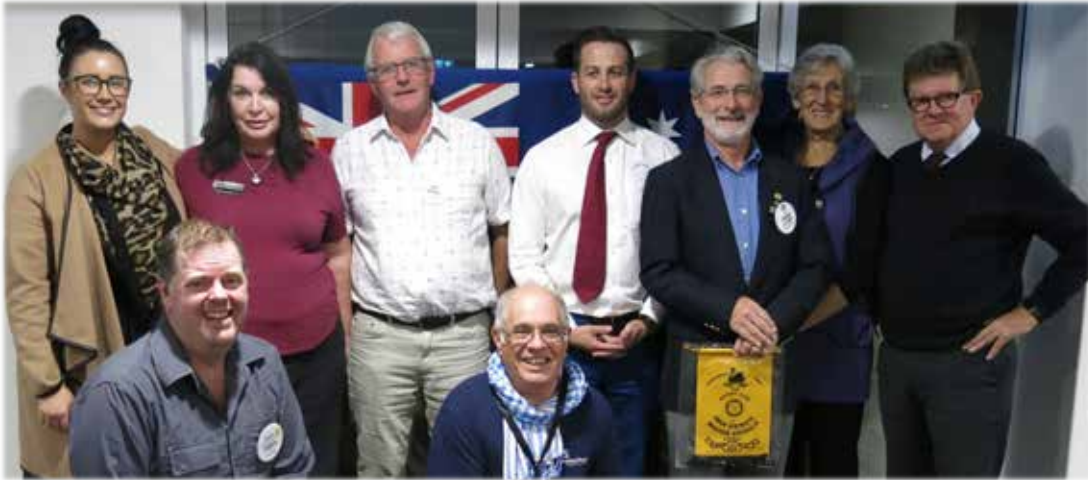
Secretary John Payne spoke on swap meet roster is going around all hands on deck.
