Sonia Cameron from Camp Quality started with fun therapy which gave members an insight to the role of Camp Quality. Sonia spoke on the fact that children age 0 – 14 cancer is the leading killer. Camp Quality has assisted 7000 children 0 -13 either have cancer or a relative with cancer. Programs are in hospital – family liaison officer – support families while a child is undergoing treatment, accessing services, puppets,

family fun day, beads of courage Pandora charm bracelet, receive a small bead for every treatment, test x ray while in hospital.

Sonia spoke on how the life child therapist works in the hospital. In the school program education on themselves or a family members who may have cancer. Kids guide to cancer phone app; where children can go and ask question on cancer. Camp quality has a program that uses puppets to educate children on cancer. All camp quality programs are free so they relied on donation

and support from the community. Camp quality runs camps during the year where participants are one on one with a volunteer for the camp. How we help hold or attend a camp/ fundraiser, donations are tax deductible. Sonia than spoke on the Camp quality car rallies.
