THE ROTARY FOUNDATION NAMED WORLD'S OUTSTANDING FOUNDATION

The Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) recognized The Rotary Foundation with its annual Award for Outstanding Foundation at its 2017 conference in San Francisco. The award honours organisations that show philanthropic commitment and leadership through financial support, innovation, encouragement of others, and involvement in public affairs.

AFP's committee of judges cited Rotary's comprehensive campaign to eradicate polio as a major driver of the selection.

The committee also mentioned that Rotary applies a methodical, purposeful approach to support a wide variety of causes, from providing clean water to educating the next generation of peace professionals.

ROTARIANS GOT IN AND CLOSED THE DOORS

2018-19 RI President Sam Owori's chief concerns as a Rotary leader are membership and extension. Since he served as district governor, the number of clubs in Uganda has swelled from nine to 89. He urges past, present, and future leaders to work together to engage more women, youth program participants, alumni, and community members to increase Rotary's membership in the coming years.

"There are many places which need Rotary and numerous potential members who have never been invited," he says. "The problem is Rotarians who got in and closed the doors."

My passion is membership and extension. But for Rotary with enviable values in a world of 7 billion to exist for 111 years and boast of 1.3 million members is pathetic. Besides, women stand at about 25%, while the average age in many countries hovers around 70 years.
