Meeting Report; 5 September 2017, by Yvonne Young

Vice President Trevor Schofield welcomed members and guests Katherine Firth from Red Cross and Steve Jnr Hladio.

Secretary John Payne's report in correspondence being circular at the meeting, invitation from Illawarra Shoalhaven suicide prevention collaboration of the black dog lifespan project in the region 14/9 Thursday in Kiama at the pavilion Kiama Showground 8.30 – 10.30.

5 minuter from Leonie Smith spoke on the Journey of having a child with Autism. How the children with Autism can be high functioning, mental capacity, the use of visual boards, Leonie used sign language. Children can be bullied at school. Behaviours can be stemming, masking in public to hide behaviours. Part of the Autism needs are for a time to debrief, tenacities to have obsession, Leonie showed a short video on Autism which showed how we are all different and how someone with Autism maybe better at art or maths though could struggle with everyday tasks.



Katherine Firth (Guest Speaker) spoke and showing a short video on the beginning of the Red Cross, the Geneva convention – Henry Dunant a Swiss Businessman after seeing wounded soldiers in the battlefield of France.

Fundamental value, the red cross means don't shoot in any language, there are three symbols a red crescent, red crystal and a red cross, the Red Cross emblem is an inversion of the Swiss flag which has a white cross on a red background. The Red Cross is best known for blood donation and for flood relief, though the Red Cross also operate Ops Shops – Nowra shop raised over \$80,000 in the last financial year.

The Red Cross also assist with Disaster relief, run programs for migration support in mainly in Sydney. The Red Cross in NSW has over 22,000 volunteers and 2,500 paid staff.

Other programs that the Red Cross operate are for the elderly social inclusion – including Telecross (provide people with a daily telephone call to check on their wellbeing), assisting people to trace family members after a being separated after a war or disaster.

For younger people, the Red Cross operates a Good start breakfast club and save a mate programs, support program involving caseworkers for young offenders and aboriginal programs including driver educations. Catherine stated that some programs could close depending on funding.
