Toast to the village of Bhalukhark, the Rotary Club of Dhulikhel in Nepal and the committee of the Business Awards for a fantastic night on Friday.

President Phil and members then gave PP Wayne Fry a round of applause for his work up to and on the night of the Business Awards.

Youth Director Andrea Tucker informed members of the upcoming RYPEN camp this weekend the club is sponsoring to 2 students attend.

Paul also spoke on the plans for 2018 NAIDOC week and the recent grant from State Government for the Lighthouse and the surrounding area. The LALC has also placed signage on the Lighthouse fence with phone numbers for suicide prevention.



Guest speaker PP Chris Neale spoke on Nepal and the Chamkharta village where the RC of Bomaderry has started a village rainwater and an education project. Chris spoke on the time he has spent on RAWCS (Rotary Australia World Community Service) project, the message was don't try and fix everything, just try and fix one thing.

The Rotary Club of Dhulikhel has been in contact with the RC of Bomaderry for several years worked on projects for Chamkharta village -90 houses, 390 people - raised money towards improving/restoring toilet sewage and water after the 2015 earthquake. RC of Dhulikhel sent back reports on monies used and budget. The RC of Bomaderry is working on a third project. Where the club is looking at a global grant with other clubs in the area possibly contributing towards the project. The proposal is to raise money to purchase a goat herd for the community of Chamkharta where the village can be self-sufficient, also looking at the women of the village to look after the herd.

Bina Adhikari spoke on how this project will empower the women in the village to assist with family upbringing. Bina has is close to the project manager and the president of the RC of Dhulikhel. Bina also spoke on how life in the country is different to city life in Nepal.

Almoner Bill Harris stated the all is well and Maisie Bennett is home from hospital.
