The model that the Dunn Lewis Foundation has adopted to assist people in training and education is called the F3style which combines education, training, employment socials skills, life skills, wellbeing. The Dunn Lewis also is do open education programs called Karabar Distance Education Centre were students can do their HSC.

The Dunn Lewis Centre is looking at expanding the employment to work experience in local business in the future.
