Meeting Report; 17 October 2017, by Yvonne Young

Members attended the premises of Ulladulla Creative Finishes (UCF), as a workplace visit. Owner operator, John Corrin spoke of his journey with the business, showcasing the new factory and equipment.

Ulladulla Creative Finishes has been operating in the Ulladulla area for the past eighteen years. Founded by John Corrin and Ian Tibbles, the business specialises in spray painting two-pack polyurethane kitchen doors. Qualified in French polishing, UCF can rejuvenate timber cupboards and bench tops. Although they are capable of transforming furniture, cars, boats, caravans, etc UCF focus on kitchens. UCF have steered away from spraying bathrooms, as water compromises the paint and peeling will ultimately occur.

An illegal burn-off near the Kings Point factory in May 2016 caused UCF to close its doors due to contamination. The result was that the factory had to be dismantled.

During this process, John acquired two spray booths from Sydney. Luckily, he had found another local factory up for rent which could accommodate his business. Work then focussed on stocking up new supplies and equipment and getting the word out that they were back up again, ready for business.



Ian had retired before the fire shut down the business. John has since bought the business and employs nine people, three of which are his children.

The evening was very relaxed, with great fellowship and a delicious banquet was served from the Ulladulla Indian Plaza Restaurant.
