## Meeting Report; 31 October 2017, by Yvonne Young

**PP Brian Morrison** gave a quick report of Blessing Of the Fleet, 26 princesses so far.

**PP Brian Morrison** gave a short talk on the Battle of Beersheba and the charge of the Light Horse brigade, gave a brief history on the light horse, where on the  $31^{st}$  October 1917 at 4pm at Beersheba the battle where the capture of Beersheba gave the British the upper in gaining the Suez canal. Used 303 light horse the Walers horses, 800 men of the light horse turned the tide Gaza fell 7<sup>th</sup> November 1917. In August 1918 the Light Horse Brigade were issued with weapons and training – light horse spear headed the charge of Damascus 75 men died and 58 wounded.

The Walers would be sold to Indians and local farmers. 169,000 horses where sent and only 2 come home Sandy and Bill the Bastard.

**Guest Speaker Alex Krilov** from MHT spoke on Suicide and road toll campaign; the road to zero in 2015 when 1,205 people died on the road though 3,227 suicided in the same year. In 2016 MHT conducted both formal – informal talk with local organisations regarding the suicide in the area in particular in area around the Lighthouse and what can be done to reduce deaths related to suicide, prevention and how to improve with signage, lighting, landscape, fencing and turn it into a touristic area for whale and dolphin watching. Members of the MHT have taken photos of the area around the Lighthouse and have done research how to keep people safe and refocus when thinking of suicide. Research into the lighthouse area and what could be achieved by beautifying the area and assist people to refocus, time to pause and rethink the thought of suicide.

**Judy Clarke** spoke on the deviation of the loss of a family member to suicide and how it can assist if the area around the lighthouse was beautified

**Jenny Martin** from MHT spoke on the working group that was formed in December 2016, and how there are representatives from community organisations including Shoalhaven City council, Police, NSW Ambulance and how the Shoalhaven suicide prevention task force where assisting with the project. Ulladulla Long board riders would like to donate money and how the community can assist in letters to Shoalhaven City Council. The taskforce is trying to get grants from federal government to continue the revamp the light house there is a grant from crown land of \$500,000 though \$280,000 to be spent on the lighthouse itself. The project has been recognised by the Black Dog institute as area hotspot and made it a priority for assistance.

**Paul Keith** would like our Club to open a trust account on behalf of the MHT, account will be used to collect donations coming towards the Lighthouse beatification project, as we are incorporated.
