Debbie worked with people after a large outbreak of food poisoning in the 90s, which after Food safety standard was updated.

Worked and wrote Woolworths food safety documents. Also, has written the small goods food safety manual and food safety auditors manual. Food safety is across all fields.

Through the work Debbie and her husband has done there has been a reduction of food poisoning incidents in Australia.
