Ken then showed members the table cloth from his mother who retrieved it from the ship wreck.

PP Rob Powell introduced Yumaro CEO **Mark Brantingham**. Mark spoke on the different role of Mullala/Yumaro organisation. Mark spoke on the stats for people with a disability where only 50% of people with a disability are employed in Australia and the idea behind the shelter workshop. Spoke on the changes in the disability area, how the Yumaro has expanded its role in the community with in house assistance, assisted learning centre and financial guidance.

Mark spoke on the project in Narooma with respite house and six independent unit valued over 1million dollars.

Mullala/Yumaro trying to operate like a normal business and the challenges it brings. Some of the ventures used are recycled cardboard for recycled was an excellent business model. Have a contact with a recycling company in Sydney, have leasing premises in Milton, to operate the cardboard and assisting with Hisway Earthmoving with sandbag making at the Milton premises. Document shredding and hoping to get a contract with Bunnings

to supply plants, though this would be a state-wide contract. Making cleaning cloths from old towels from hotel, then suppling cleaning cloths to Bunning nationwide though one state at a time. Currently has a contract with Southern Cross housing for maintenance including lawn mowing, garden maintenance.
