Nina Cheyne, guest speaker; Nina is a Parkinson's Clinical Nurse Consultant Nina covers the area from Kiama to North Durras, previously worked in an Intensive Care Unit, Cardiology and Neurology Nursing

Parkinson's disease (PD) is a chronic progressive neurodegenerative movement disorder affecting an estimated 74,000 adult Australians. Approximately 1/3 of those affected live in NSW.

PD is a result of changes to a region called the Basal Ganglia - where deficits in the neurotransmitter Dopamine affect smooth fluid movement.

Patients with PD shuffle their feet or freeze while walking, have tremors, anxiety, write small and can happen at any age. PD cannot be detected with scans, could be caused by having a stroke, epilepsy, trauma, tumours or brain infection.

The Parkinson's Nurse is primarily an advocate for the Person with Parkinson's (PWP) who enter hospitals and aged care facilities and performs an important role in up-skilling other nurses and GP's with knowledge regarding the specific needs (particularly in terms of medication management) of PWP who require acute care.
