March 15th in the year 2010 marks a significant milestone in the history of the Rotary Club of Milton Ulladulla Inc., being the 50th Anniversary of the inaugural meeting of the provisional Rotary Club in 1960, later to be granted a Charter by Rotary International April 10th 1960. This Charter was presented by the then District 270 Governor Fred Fischer on June 18th 1960. Since its Charter the Milton Ulladulla Rotary Club has established a reputation within the community and within the Jurisdiction of Rotary as a Club of action, leaving a legacy of enduring impact on the local community and the Rotary District. It is appropriate in reviewing Club History to consider relevant contributions in the four Avenues of Rotary Service, Club, Vocational, Community, International and as well as contributions at District and International level. The Rotary Club of Milton Ulladulla was sponsored by the Rotary Club of Nowra. Past President Tom Tait was appointed the District Governors Special Representative to investigate the formation of a Rotary Club in Milton Ulladulla District. Past President Tom Tait invited 20 business and professional men from the area designated for the Club to the inaugural meeting held at the CWA Hall Milton.







Earlier Days

THE SURVEYORS played important parts in carrying out necessary explanatory work, mapping new country, surveying new estates, and advising prospective settlers of suitable areas. Settlers and pioneers laboured under difficulties of appliance and transport and limitations of personal comfort, which to-day, we can scarcely understand. They grew their own wheat in the early days and ground their own flour. There were no bridges and goods were brought by bullock wagon, or steamer.

SETTLERS must have been frugal, industrious, men of sound judgement, courage, and perseverence, who desired honest trading and good Government. They acknowledged a Power greater than their own, so they built Churches to prove their religious principles, and that they were God-fearing, God-worshiping men. You cannot remove the history of civilization without removing the Churches. The history of men and women who have made any district is somewhere bound up in local Church history.

ANGLICANS claim services held by Rev. Thomas Kendall from 1828. Present Church of St. Peter & St. Paul, Milton, built in 1859. Earlier Church building was used as a Parish Hall until new Hall built.

METHODISTS claim services from 1851. A timber Church was built 1857. Present stone building, Milton, built 1883.

CATHOLIC CHURCH, Milton, was in course of erection in January, 1860, but foundation stone cannot be traced. Claim services held in early 1800's.

CONGREGATIONALISTS claim services several years befort present stone Church, Milton, opened 1872.

All services before organised Church work, were held by visiting Clergy and Priests, in homes, or buildings, or out of doors.

1770. APRIL 21st, 7 a.m. Captain Cook, aboard the Endeavour, saw and named Pigeon House Mountain. Wrote in his journal that it resembled a square dove house, with dome on the top (Aboriginal name, "Dithol.")

1822. January. Alex. Berry, Hamilton Hume and Thomas Davidson explored Pigeon House region, sailing up River Clyde from Bateman's Bay to Yadboro, and ascended Pigeon House, and found run of water at foot of cone top.

1828. OCTOBER. Second survey of this area by Surveyor Robert Hoddle, who named "The Castle" (native name, "Cooyoyo"). Hoddle became first Surveyor General of Victoria — and had honour and charge of laying out City of Melbourne.

1822. January. Considered Berry, Hume and Davidson entered Conjola and Narrawallee Creek. 1828. ULLADULLA HARBOUR surveyed by Thomas Florance in May.

1828. SEVERAL MONTHS later Rev. Thomas Kendall was guided into Ulladulla Harbour by a native aboard his small boat. Harbour called "Woolladerrah" by natives — said to mean "Safe Harbour.' Kendall tok up grant of land that year, including "Kendalldale." He began first white settlement at Ulladulla. He was drowned when his schooner "Brisbane," capsized off Currambene Beach, Shoalhaven.

1828. CROOBYAR ESTATE settlement established by Alex Macleay. Co. Secty. N.S.W. Govt. Croobyar means "Place of the Possums." Estate outlined Surveyor Hoddle.

1828. MAY. Mollymook and part of Narrawallee surveyed by Thomas Florance. Also surveyed Burrill Lake and named upper portion Terra-Bona Creek.

1828. MR. ROBERT GARRAD first white inhabitant of Ulladulla. 1930. Garrad's daughter, Elizabeth, first white baby born in District.

1829. 1st JUNE. Ulladulla among list of towns published by proclamation.

1833. SURVEYOR F. T. RUSDEN, surveyed from Sassafras district along Table Mountain, foll. Pigeon House Range southerly to Pigeon House northern portion of Table Mountain, "Womballonay," and high peak on S.W. of Table Mountain, "Talaterang."

1839. HENRY CLARENCE KENDALL (poet) and twin brother, Basil Edward Kendall, born at "Kirmington," Ulladulla (now Milton). Sons of Basil and Matilda Kendall (nee McNally). Grandsons of Rev. Thomas Kendall. Henry Kendall wrote "I was born in the forest, and the mountains were my sponsors." These twin babies were cradled in the bark of a stringy bark, stripped off intact, and holding the two babies feet to feet.

1800's. When first white settlements established, there were considered to be some 600 aboriginals in district, divided into two tribes, Pigeon House Blacks and Coastal Blacks. At certain periods, by mutual arrangement, the two tribes would meet for friendly conference on "Kingiman" Mountain Range between Pigeon House and sea. "Kingiman" means Meeting Place.

1859. Township of Milton surveyed by Henry G. Morton for John Booth, who purchased "Myrtle Farm," and had town laid out.

1860. 1st JANUARY. Milton Post Office established. Known as "The Settlement" for several days before being named Milton. Postmark in existence to prove this. First Postmaster, George Knight.

1860. JANUARY. Milton Township lots offered by auction, by John Booth. Auctioneer, H. G. Morton (Mr. Jack Woods has copy of original plan).

1860. Blackburn's Milton Store opened.

1861. Original Ulladulla Public School opened. Present building, 1868.

1864. "Milton Times" established.

1869. First Show held by Milton A. & H. Association.

1870. Commercial Bank, Milton, established. Present building, 1875.

1870. Ulladulla Boundaries defined.

1871. Milton Shire Hall opened.

1874. First Council, Municipality, Ulladulla, sat on June 24th. Mr. David Warden, Mayor, and Messrs. Miles Berry, R. Seccombe, T. McGee, D. Boag, J. Evans, W. Ewin, Ed. Kendall, H. Millard.

1875 First Telegraph Office opened, Ulladulla, by E. T. Mulligan.

1876. MARCH. First Telegraph Office opened, Milton, by E. T. Mulligan, who left Miss L. Gambell to manage Ulladulla.

1877. Milton Public School opened.

1879. Croobyar Public School opened, now demolished.

1883. Faust's Milton business founded. Newsagency added 1900 (before that P.O. used to sell newspapers).

MILTON & ULLADULLA HOSPITAL. Transferred from Bush Nursing Association to Milton District Hospital, 7th September, 1936. Changed name to Milton & Ulladulla Hospital 22nd July, 1938.

MILTON A. & H. SOCIETY have held 91 Annual Shows, but some further years were missed because of weather or war. Date of first Show not yet traced.

ULLADULLA-MILTON BRANCH SHOALHAVEN DIS-TRICT AMBULANCE. Service opened 1st July, 1950. Ulladulla Station opened 4th June, 1955.

BANK OF N.S.W., MILTON, opened September, 1953.

ULLADULLA LIGHTHOUSE believed over 100 years old. First erected Harbour Wharf. Removed to Warden's Head later.

MAIN INDUSTRIES OF DISTRICT. Dairying, Timber, Silica and Fishing Fleet.

MILTON COURT HOUSE AND POLICE STATION. Thought to have been here about 90 years. Enquiries sent Comm. Police. No date on building.

MOLLYMOOK SURF LIFE SAVING CLUB founded 1934.

MILTON GOLF CLUB formed 1932. Reconstituted and named Mollymook Golf Club, 1952.

C.W.A. MILTON DISTRICTS BRANCH. Founded 1947. Present building 1957.



CLUB HISTORY - No. 1

1960-1961

It has been decided to print some Club history from former years from time to time in the bulletin and Historian Ken Kendall has given us the first snippet which refers to the year the Club was formed in 1960 and to the first Board Meeting held after the Club had been chartered in June of that year.

Matters discussed included the fact that £50 (\$100) be given to Rotary Foundation for the year; that Rotary members be rostered as stewards each week to wait upon the tables (in those days private caterers supplied the meals in the CWA Hall in Milton); it was decided that a portrait of the Queen would be presented to the newly formed Batemans Bay Club on their Charter Night; Vocational Service was endeavouring to have Technical Education started in the District and it was hoped that the Motor Trade might be the first Trade considered. Treasurer Frank Denshire gave his Financial Statement showing that the Club had the princely sum of £71.2.4 (\$142.23); it was decided that the first Ladies Night for the Club would be held on 13th December, 1960 at the cost of 15/-(\$1.50) per head; the erection of Rotary signs at each end of the District was a project underway and rental for meetings each week was to be £1 (\$2) per night; finally a guest speaker who had stayed overnight at the Commercial Hotel had left behind a bill which was to be settled by the Club, a total cost of £2.7.2 (\$4.72). It makes you think how times have changed.

Fresh tenders were called for catering at the CWA Hall where meetings were held and Mrs L Switzer was successful (she catered for the Club for a number of years thereafter); the Club supported the nomination of Frank Moorhouse from Nowra Club as District Governor of District 275 (now District 975) for 1963-1964 year; Frank was eventually the successful nomination; the Board moved that a Presidential Collar of Office should be purchased (this Collar was still on show every Tuesday night around the neck of the President until 2005). One of the main projects of the Club in the year was the beautification of Brodie Park in Burrill Street North Ulladulla (this Park was of course finally handed over to Shoalhaven Council which still maintains it). The Club was very proud of having won the Attendance Shield at the District 270 (now 9710) Conference held at Orange in 1962; this requires a short explanation as our Club commenced as part of District 270 which covers South Eastern NSW and ACT and a good portion of the Central and South West of the State, with Lake Cargelligo the furthest inland Club; after two years in this District the Clubs on the South Coast south of Nowra to Narooma and the Southern Highlands Club were changed over to District 275 which at that time ran from the Sydney Harbour Bridge through Wollongong and down the coast; this of course again changed when in 1977 all Australian Districts had their prefix changed from "2" to "9" and the new District 971 which is of course our current District came into being.

One of the features of this year was a visit by Hurstville Rotary Club who had a social weekend in the area early in 1962 (Leo O'Donahoo who was a former chemist in this area and has now retired here was at that time in Hurstville Club and arranged the visit). Another project was the production of a tape which was forwarded to the Club of Milton Ontario, Canada outlining information about our Club and District. A Rotarian from Young Club joined our Club when he moved to the District, being the late Os Watson a retired surveyor and Senior Active Member; also during this year the Charter President of the Club, Phil Berner, resigned because of the loss of classification when he sold his Pharmacy in Ulladulla to Bruce Ward (incidentally Phil purchased this Pharmacy from Leo O'Donahoo).

The District Governor for the year was Frank Moorhouse, from Nowra. The first Ladies Night held had dinner charges of seventeen shillings and sixpence per person. The Club Treasurer reported in November that the finances were in a strong state with a credit balance of $\pm 107.7.10$. The project for the year was the completion of 2 tourist maps in Milton and Ulladulla and was the "baby" of Fred James. In addition to the members of the Club and other Rotarians, special thanks were given for assistance in constructing and completing the maps to the Police Department, the Department of the Attorney General and Justice, the NSW Real Estate Office, Shire of Shoalhaven, Austral Bronze Co Pty Ltd, Austral Plaster Co, Commonwealth Portland Cement, British Paints, JC Goodwin and Co Ltd, Nowra Brick Works, Claude Neon Ltd, HEC Robinson Pty Ltd, and Wunderlich Ltd. The keys for both maps were finally presented on 30th June, 1964 to the then President of Shoalhaven Shire, Councillor Bruce McIntosh. During the year Wal Atkinson resigned from the Club and was replaced on the Board of Directors by the late Gordon Kelly. A competition for school students was promoted during the year and they were invited to write essays on the "Four Way Test", with 2 prizes of £3.00 each to the winners. A dinner was arranged in conjunction with a wine tasting promotion by the Wine and Brandy producers Association. This was a Ladies Night at a cost of twenty five shillings each.



Mrs Turnbull replaces Mrs Fae as Caterer for the Milton Ulladulla Rotary Club.




A \$40.00 donation to the Peter Pan Preschool Kindergarten was forwarded to sponsor the attendance of an underprivileged child.


Miss Janelle Davis left Milton Ulladulla for her exchange trip to Witten West Germany.



We supported a District Project "The Aero Medical Helicopter Rescue Service" by donating \$2,500.00. Our Club was also involved in Clean Up Australia.


