The meeting was open to the general public to hear the interesting story of Dr Michael Davey travels around Australia raising money and awareness in Kids cancer.

Michael's motivation for the trip around Australia was Terry Fox who has been voted Canada's inspiration man, raising over 12 million dollars for cancer research.

As Dr Michael rode around Australia, he kept going as he raised \$2.00 for every kilometre. One goal was to produce a photo book of the photography of places around Australia.

Michael's ride started in Nowra and travelled north then across to Broome and heading south including Tasmania. Michael gave a very interesting talk on his experiences as he rode through out, he did comedy acts in the roadhouse along the journey and collected donations in a bucket.

Michael learnt how to ride with the road trains in central Australia. He was amazed at the friendship and kindness offered to him and his wife, as he battled the elements. Michael stated that he should have ridden 5-6 weeks after he did due to heat in central Australia, though was amazed at the tail wind that followed him on his journey.

Michael has published three books on his journey including a book of photographs of his journey and a biography on the journey.

To assist Dr Michael Davey in his quest for raising money for Kids Cancer research, people attending the night purchased raffle tickets in a food hamper won by Bev Nicholas. An auction was conducted by Rob Powell.
