President Phil Brown opened meeting welcoming members and guest speaker from the Cancer Council Jarrod Flynn.

- President Phil stated that the raffle and auction from the Dr Michael Davy night raised \$1,300 the club donated \$1,500 to Kid Cancer research. Thanks to all who purchased, donated and assisted in the night.

International toast – Rotary Club of Odessa Ukraine for the contributing so much to the community and International with only 17 members.

Guest Speaker Jarrod Flynn spoke on a recent community meeting which people attending stated that people didn't know what happen to the money after a fundraising event for the Cancer Council such as Relay for Life. Jarrod explain where the money goes after a fundraising event. Monies raised goes into research, information and support, advocacy, prevention.

Jarrod explained that the Cancer council has no government funding - 95% of money is from fundraising and 5% through benefactors.

The Cancer Council's mission is to reduce the impact of cancer of someone with cancer and their families. Though the main goal of the Cancer Council is working towards a cancer free future.

The Cancer Council is assisting people undertreatment by providing accommodation either in Sydney through Accord group of hotels at a reduced rate or staying at Nowra in the Cancer Care Centre free accommodation. Also provides transport as a gap service to people going to treatment. Peer support program

Cancer Council also provides an Information centre at the Shoalhaven Cancer house at SDMH and a financial assistance \$350.00 as a one off for a bill or expenses.

Advocacy ensure that people with cancer are being treated in a respectful manner.

Research - clinical towards a noncancer future and tests that are least invasive.
