### **Community Services Report**

### ACTIVITY REPORT FOR 2017-2018

In addition to performance of the usual duties of a Rotary member (manning at swap meet, BoTF, bouncing castle, ballast bag filling) my activities as CSD over the past twelve months have focussed on two primary targets:

- the "Under Didthul" Choral Competition; and
- the Warden Headland refurbishment as a response to male suicide at that venue.

### **UNDER DIDTHUL:**

Although conceived and implemented in more than ample time, the choral competition was stillborn due primarily to a failure to propagate promotional information to the target audience in good time - or, indeed, in any time - despite promises by third parties this would happen.

If this event is ever to be considered again in the future, it is essential that a reliable and professional public relations company be involved at early stages of planning so that the target audience is properly apprised of the event and its conduct.

• RCMU should revisit the concept, perhaps primarily as a festival with a competition element; and

• it is a very good idea and has the potential to raise a lot of money for our works and bring income into the community at a quiet time of the year (September).

I began planning the event in July 2107 after endorsement of the RCMU Board, and it was ready for entries in 14th February 2018. In that 30-week period I spent an average of 20-25 hours per week, for a total of about 600 hours. My work included event design and conception, formulation of rules and details, graphics and artwork, finding and securing venues, EOI and entry pro forma, licensing and regulators, and a lot of online research. Plus RCMU web site changes.

### THE LIGHTHOUSE FOUNDATION:

As a member of Rotary I was invited to join a local Suicide prevention group comprising

- Ulladulla Local Aboriginal Lands Council;
- a Milton-based Buddhist group;
- Ulladulla Community Mental Health;
- Ulladulla Mens health;
- the NSW Lands Department;
- Mission Australia;
- the Clark family; and
- Rotary Club of Milton-Ulladulla.

### **Community Services Report**

This group is not a legal entity and so can not operate bank accounts. Many of the members are constrained under their terms of employment (in government departments) so I had the idea of Rotary being a perfect conduit for these activities, and initiated the notion of the "Lighthouse Foundation" to bypass any stigma and negative associations associated with the word "suicide". The word "Lighthouse" carries within it the notion of help and security which is something we want to offer. In summary, the Lighthouse Foundation is a Rotary initiative whose focus is mens health and suicide prevention. The Foundation will raise money to be able to provide interventions aimed at fostering the objective.

At the time of writing, the Foundation has attracted a \$2,000 donation from The Entertainers proceeds and monies earned from the RMC Duntroon band concert will also find their way into the account. I believe there are others lining up to donate also.

As a retired architect, I provided my design skills pro bono to the group by designing the refurbishment of the Headland and then preparing the contract documents. I believe the design was rather well received. I estimate the work took me about 50 hours - plus the time required to attend the group meetings and many phone calls and emails - say 60 hours in total.
