Guest speaker Peter Coroneos spoke on one of his profession in IT and how he assisted in introducing the internet to Australia. Peter has co written a book on cybercrime with a PR friend of his. Peter spoke on partnering with U3A to educate older Australians in cybercrime, awareness of the extent of cyber and scram callers in Australia.

Since 1988, we've seen a worldwide reduction in polio cases of 99.9%. Last year we only saw wild polio cases in 3 countries.
